# RESULTS: THIS IS WHAT GIFTS ACHIEVED LAST YEAR

**461 SENIOR** residents received home delivered or congregate meals that provided nourishment and companionship

**455 INDIVIDUALS** received 11,869 nights of shelter; 70% were able to secure stable housing

**192 INDIVIDUALS** developed the skills needed for employment; 62% maintained employment throughout the year

**1,315,637 MEALS** were provided through area food pantries and shelters



**117 VICTIMS** of domestic violence or abuse and their children received safe shelter and counseling

**\$2.27 MILLION** in tax refunds and poverty-fighting tax credits were received by Elgin families and individuals

**5,574 BACKPACKS** filled with nutritious food were distributed weekly to hungry children during the school year and summer months

**998 INDIVIDUALS** received mental health therapy services; 78% showed sustained improvements for one year

**6,856 DENTAL VISITS** were provided for preventative and restorative care

# EDUCATION

Learning begins at birth, but many parents do not realize their critical role as their children's first teacher. Early learning can take many forms, from parental interaction to childcare programs to formal preschool education. These early learning experiences are important, as they can shape a child's entire academic future. When children start kindergarten ready to learn and equipped with the necessary language

and literacy skills they are more likely to be reading at grade level in third grade and more likely to graduate high school on time with a plan for college or career training.

In Elgin, 69% of incoming non-English speaking kindergarteners and 50% of incoming English speaking kindergarteners arrive below the School District U-46 Literacy Benchmark. One third of these students cannot identify a single letter of the alphabet. Additionally, the school district only has capacity for about 28% of Elgin's preschool-aged children; the rest are left paying preschool tuition at other centers. With 74% of Elgin's preschoolers living below the poverty threshold, those who cannot attend the district's programs are likely not attending any preschool program.

## OUR EDUCATION GOALS ARE:

- To provide children with the core skills to succeed in school and ensure a healthy start
- To build literacy skills to ensure all students are reading at grade level by the end of 3rd grade
- To provide opportunities for college and career readiness to ensure a community of engaged and successful adults

United Way of Elgin is working with its partner agencies and through our initiatives to make sure children enter schools with the skills they need to succeed in school and in life.

# INITIATIVES



## THE ALIGNMENT COLLABORATIVE FOR EDUCATION

(ACE) is a framework for organizing and aligning community organizations and resources in support of public schools. With increased coordination, ACE changes how we work together and transforms the ways in which the community engages with the school districts.

### The key principles of the alignment model include:

- The work is organized around the priorities of School District U-46 and community partners are invited to participate in coordinated activities that support the school district's strategic plan.
- The work is generational. It requires a long-term commitment.
- The work is focused on students who need the most support in order to be successful.
- Coordination of the community and its resources is highly structured and accountable for results.

A Governing Board of Directors sets the agenda for ACE. They are the highest level of leadership for the collaboration. An Operating Board makes the day-to-day decisions and is action-oriented. Three A-Teams focused around Early Childhood Development, Trauma-Informed Care, and Educational Pathways do tactical planning and implementation. These teams drive the process, carrying out innovative solutions to the identified issues.

# RESULTS: THIS IS WHAT GIFTS ACHIEVED LAST YEAR


**12,000 FAMILIES** with preschoolers received Getting Ready for Kindergarten calendars

**98% OF CHILDREN** who participated in a family literacy program with their parents achieved age-appropriate English language skills to prepare them for kindergarten

**4,303 CHILDREN** received a free book each month from Dolly Parton's Imagination Library

**22 READING BUDDIES** provided more than 300 volunteer hours reading to preschool children

**47 THIRD-GRADE STUDENTS** received tutoring to help raise their reading and math scores. 81% increased their proficiency in reading in one school year. 85% increased their proficiency in math.



**531 CHILDREN** received quality childcare, preschool and early intervention services; 96% reached age-appropriate developmental milestones



**1,073 YOUTH** participated in an after-school program that helped them maintain or improve their grades
